Once you are admitted to a paid apprenticeship program, you can become a carpenter, carpet installer, cement mason, construction equipment operator, construction laborer, drywall installer, electrician, elevator installer, glazier, insulation worker, painter, plumber, plasterer, roofer, sheet metal worker, structural and reinforcing iron worker . . . (many others).

3. Work as a paid apprentice and receive training paid for by the union (two to five years).

2. Apply for an apprenticeship in a construction trade that interests you. This will involve a test and an interview, which the class will prepare you for.

1. Participate in the Pasadena/Altadena Apprenticeship Preparation Program (240 hours) offered three times a year (spring, summer & fall) through the PCC/CEC.

You can have a career in the construction trades that pays \$60,000 to \$100,000+ per year. Here are the steps that lead to your career:

Apprenticeship Preparation Program

HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Apprenticeship Preparation Program helps Pasadena/Altadena young adults gain entry into paid apprenticeships in the construction trades.

When & where & dates:

February 21, 2012 - June 17, 2012

Class I:

Jackie Robinson Center, 1020 N. Fair Oaks Avenue, room 310.

Monday through Friday: 2:00 p.m. to 5:45 p.m.

Class II:

Villa Parke Community Center, 363 E. Villa Street, room 206.

Monday through Thursday: 6:00 p.m. to 9:45 p.m.

Class Focus:

Basic safety; introduction to construction math, hand tools, power tools, and blue prints; basic rigging; communication and employability skills; "green" construction. The classes are taught by instructors from Pasadena City College.

In addition to classroom instruction, you will meet with union representatives, contractors and developers, and you will visit apprenticeship training centers and construction sites, including a LEED certified site that features "green" construction.

Requirements:

(1) 17 1/2 or older; (2) high school diploma or equivalent or agreement to enroll in GED program; (3) time and desire to commit to the 240-hour program, with 100% attendance; and (4) genuine desire to work in one of the construction trades.
