

FLINTRIDGE CENTER'S WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Flintridge Retreat Center is equipped with a waste sorting station and we ask that you take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with its proper use. The waste sorting station (described below) includes signage that will help direct where the waste should be discarded.

<p>Any plant or animal based items and ALL paper.</p>	<p>Any plastic material that is visibly marked with a recycling sign and number between 1 and 7.</p> <p>These items must be rinsed before discarding.</p>	<p>Any materials discarded and destined for the landfill that are classified as neither recyclable nor compostable.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Food waste (i.e., meat, bones, fish, cheese, other dairy products) • LABELED Bio-degradable tableware (cups, utensils, plates, etc.) • Paper towels, paper plates & paper cups • Paper cups with wax lining • Juice or milk cartons • Paper (i.e., napkins, food packaging, pizza boxes, sandwich/cake boxes, paper trays, cardboard boxes, newspaper, office/copy paper, note pads, envelopes, etc.) • Green waste/yard waste • Non-plastic, non-metallic, non-glass items 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Empty water bottles (remove the cap - cap goes in trash) • Plastic containers • Plastic tableware & serving utensils • Aluminum cans (soda cans) • Metal containers • Aluminum serving trays • Styrofoam 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Soiled plastic or aluminum packing (i.e., candy or granola bar type wrappers, plastic baggies, chip bags) • Integrated recyclable and compostable materials (i.e., juice boxes, juice pouches, TerraPack packaging, bottle caps, etc.) • Non-labeled plastic items (i.e., laminate film, plastic toys, pen casings, plastic plates, trays and serving utensils)
